

## MEDIA STATEMENT

Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC)'s **Concert Hall** and **Cremorne Theatre are set to open again next week** as part of a staged approach to the Centre's recovery after the recent floods.

After being closed for more than three weeks, the Concert Hall will reopen on a high note with Opera Queensland's 2022 season opener, *The Sopranos* on 29 March – 2 April, celebrating the bold and rebellious roles women have played throughout the history of opera.

Later in the week, the Cremorne Theatre will reopen from 1 April for the world premiere production of Roald Dahl's *The Twits* by shake & stir theatre co. in perfect time for the school holidays.

QPAC's Lyric Theatre was the first theatre to re-open its doors on 18 March with the continuation of Disney's blockbuster production of *Frozen the Musical* which runs for another six weeks.

The Centre was inundated with water through its basements and carparks and recovery is ongoing due to impact assessments and repair work required.

A reopening date for the Playhouse is yet to be announced.

Any performance cancellations have been and will continue to be communicated directly with ticketholders providing details for transfers or refunds. All *Frozen the Musical* ticketholders are being offered the opportunity to transfer to performances later in the season.

Whilst QPAC's Performing Arts (P1) carpark remains closed due to flooding impacts all patrons are encouraged to park at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre (BCEC) with pre-paid carparking vouchers honoured by BCEC.
